ConnectAbility customers currently reside throughout Newcastle, Lake Macquarie, Central Coast, Port Stephens, Maitland, Wyong and other Lower Hunter local government areas.





Today we support over 500 people living within the greater Hunter through;

- Aged Care support for older community members. This in home or community assistance includes taking away the domestic tasks that you are finding harder to complete, getting you to appointments or shopping or providing a way to meet with others in a community setting. Stay in your own home and maintain the life you have built with just the little bit of support you need.
- Art in the community or within Residential Aged Care. ConnectAbility provide an outcomes based enjoyable art program to aged care providers and their residents or individuals in the Hunter. It has proved you are never too old to find a new talent. The program also helps retain gross and fine motor skills, improve memory and connect people to their past, present and community.
- **Community Activities** available through our centre at Jesmond where we facilitate a children's playgroup, activities for school children during the holidays or after school, adolescent and family counselling for children aged 9 to 18, and programs and activities to assist those new to Australia settle into community life.
- Hall Hire for functions. At Jesmond and Silveridge Community Centre you can hire a Hall or room for a one off function or meeting or for an ongoing activity. The Halls are managed on behalf of Newcastle City Council.
- **Community Disability** support assisting people with a disability get out and about into the community living the lives they choose. We can empower people to achieve goals and dreams whether they are vocational, educational, recreational or social. We look to break down barriers and demonstrate that people with a disability have skills they can share.
- Support Coordination for people with disabilities and their families. Let one of our Support Coordination team members talk about how they can link you with the services and supports you need. This could be helping you understand your NDIS plan, finding a therapy support, having home modifications installed in your home or looking for a place to live.
- **Supported Independent Living** where we help you live independently as possible in one of our homes. We will support you to learn new living skills, make new friends and be the person you know you are in a safe welcoming home environment.
